


Little else is known of Henrys early years. When war was declared on the 4th August 1914 he was aged 22 and like many would be called to serve.

Henry was attested in to service on the 21st May 1915 aged 23. He was 5 foot 6 ½ in inches, with a 34 inch chest and good vision. He was still living at 41 Belper Street. He was given an initial service number 455 and posted to the Royal Army Medical Corp. He gave his mother as his next of kin.


2nd Western General Hospital (Central Secondary School, Whitworth Street) and another building on Duice Avenue

On the 10^{1h} May 1916 Henry left the UK 'en-route (ER) to join a service unit in the Egyptian Expeditionary Force (EEF) probably traveling through France to Marseilles then by ship to Alexandria arriving on the 22nd May.



Henry was almost certainly part of a draft posted to the 1/1 East Lancashire Field Ambulance (ELFA). They had been on the Gallipoli peninsular 1915 and evacuated to Egypt in the January of 1916, part of the 42nd Division.



By July 1916 the 42nd Division was 'guarding' N°2^A section of the Suez around El Ballah and El Ferdan







The 42nd Division was not prepared for the conditions they found in the Sinai desert. They had not been trained to operate in heavy sand in mid summer heat, and with insufficient water, the men suffered extreme distress

After several Turkish attacks east of the Suez the 42nd Division with other units advanced through the desert participating in the Battle of Romani in August 1916 and the advance from Romani to Katia.




By the 17th January 1917 the 42nd Division was no longer in the Sinai Campaign, having been among the first of the Territorial Force to receive orders for a move to the British Expeditionary Force (BEF) Western Front.






Men Boarding the Transylvania and Transylvania in Marseilles.



On arrival in Marseilles the men entrained arriving at the Weston Front, Pont Remy on the 5th March at 7:20am. The ground was covered in 2 inches of snow, a vast difference to the desert they had left less then a week before. They marched to Bray les Mareuil to billets.






Havrincourt wood and the surrounding landscape




The Ypres - Potijez medical evacuation route and posts from 28^{th} August to 11^{th} September 1917











Plans for Dressing Station Ypres




XV Corp Main Dressing Station 2 locations 1st at Goote-Kwinte Farm then near Oosthoek
