In early 1918 John found him self admitted to the 1st Southern General Hospital, no doubt through illness transmitted form patients. From the 17th January to the 5th February (20 days) with Influenza, then from the 5th February to the 28th March with a Hernia (51days) . He was admitted again from the 27th June to the 3rd July with influenza.

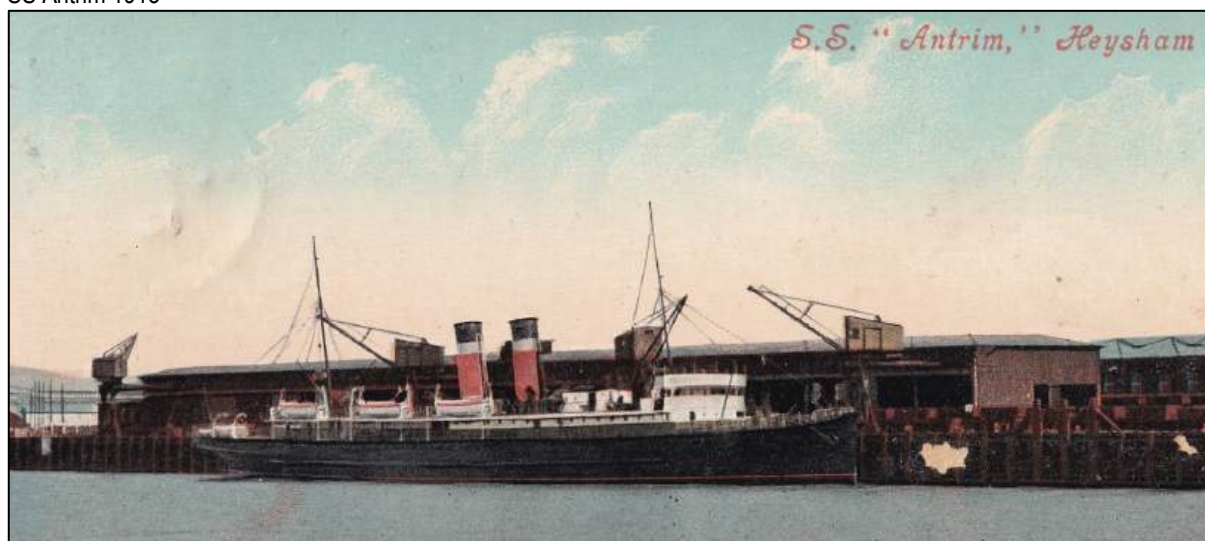

4 weeks later John was heading overseas, to Salonica (Greece) with No20 Reinforcement's. He embarked at Southampton on the 8th November disembarking at Cherbourg on the 9th November. He then travelled across land to Taranto in southern Italy.

The line of communication war diary for Cherbourg shows the troopship 'Antrim' the only ship arriving on the 9th November with 52 officers and 770 men of the AVC and RAMC for Egypt and Salonika. A troop train left the same day for Taranto and Salonika with almost 54 officers and 752 men. John was almost certainly one of these.

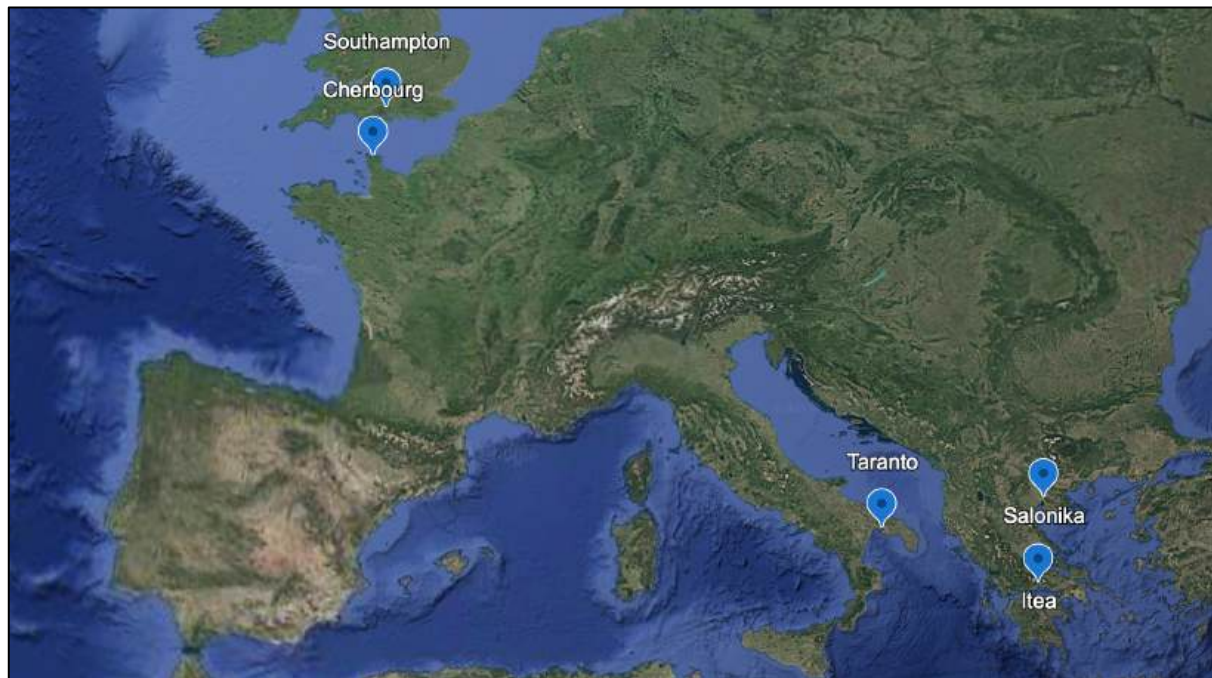

It was during this train journey to Taranto that John saw the war come to an end on the 11th November 1918. Despite this his journey continued.

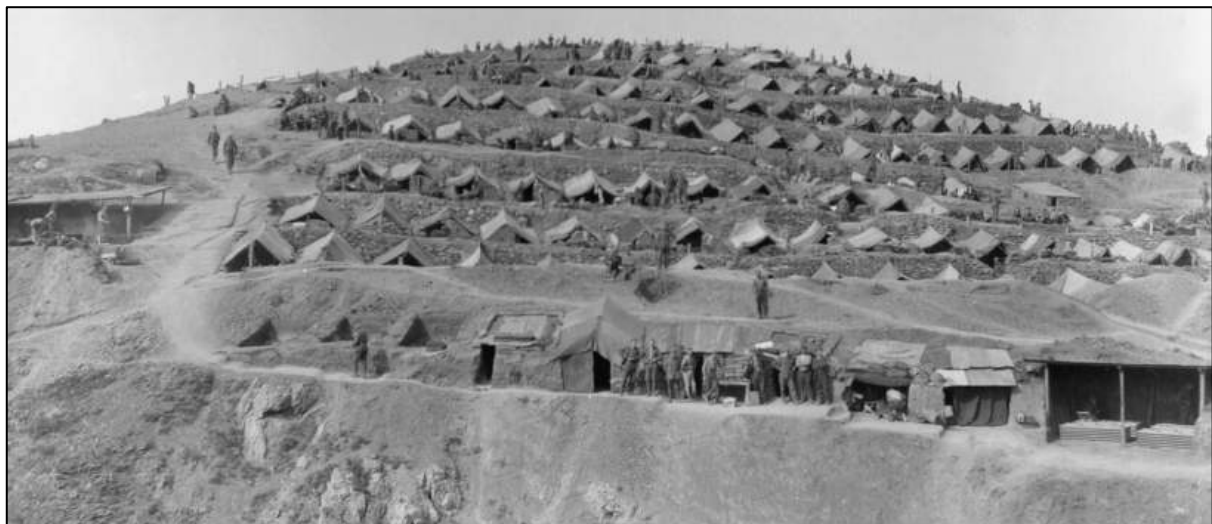

At the Salonika General Base Depot he was assessed by another medical board that classified him B2, 39 years old and a 'poor physique'. This base depot was probably Summer Hill Camp 30 miles north of Salonika and the main British transit and Depot camp.

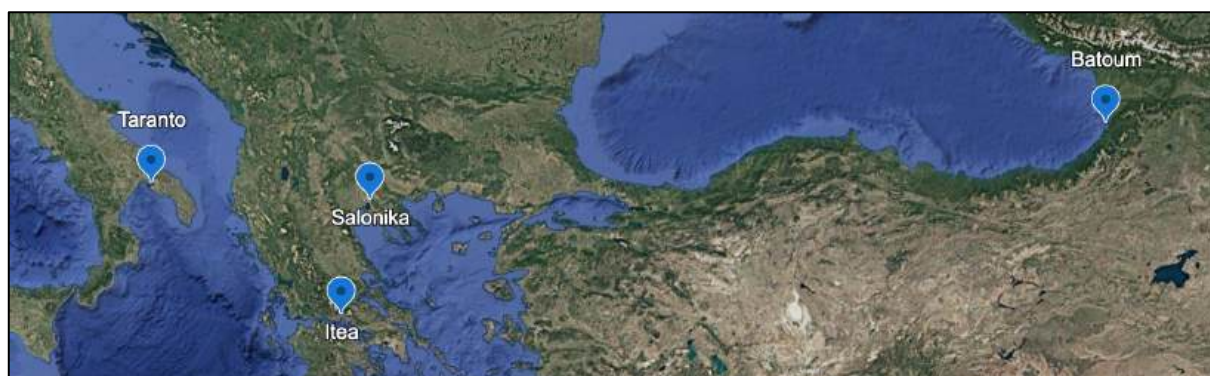

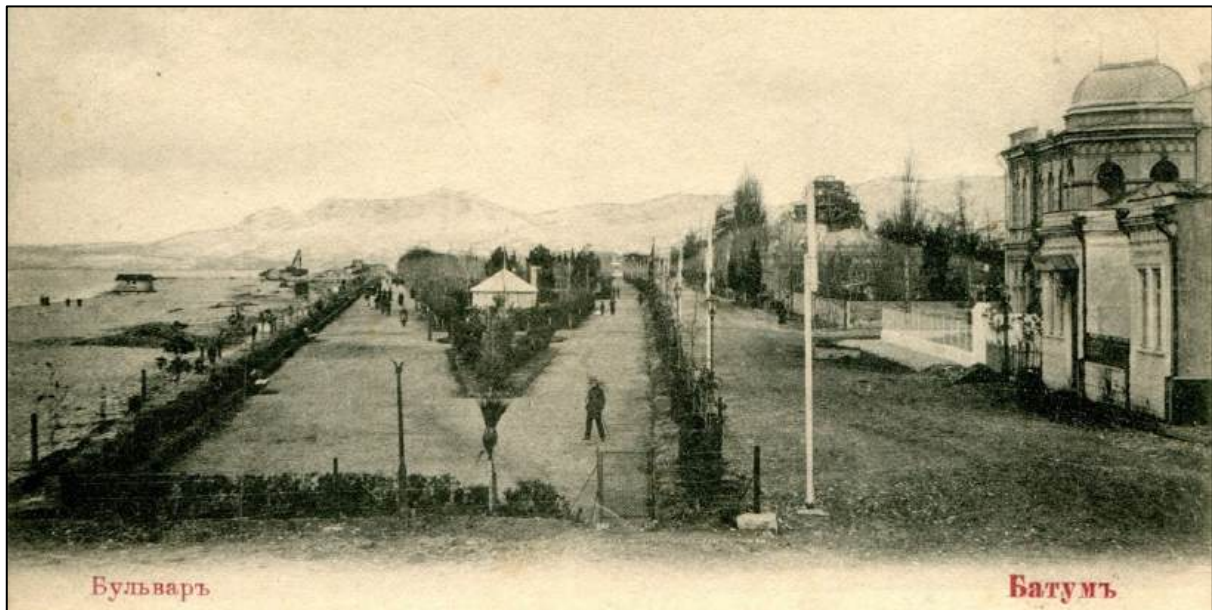

No18 Stationary was withdrawn from Salonika to support 27th Division in the Caucasus along with 21 Stationary Hospital. The 27th Division occupied posts in Armenia & Georgia. No18 & 21 Stationary Hospitals were at Batoum. All the units associated with 27th Division were disbanded along with 27th Division in September 1919 as part of the withdrawal from the Caucasus.

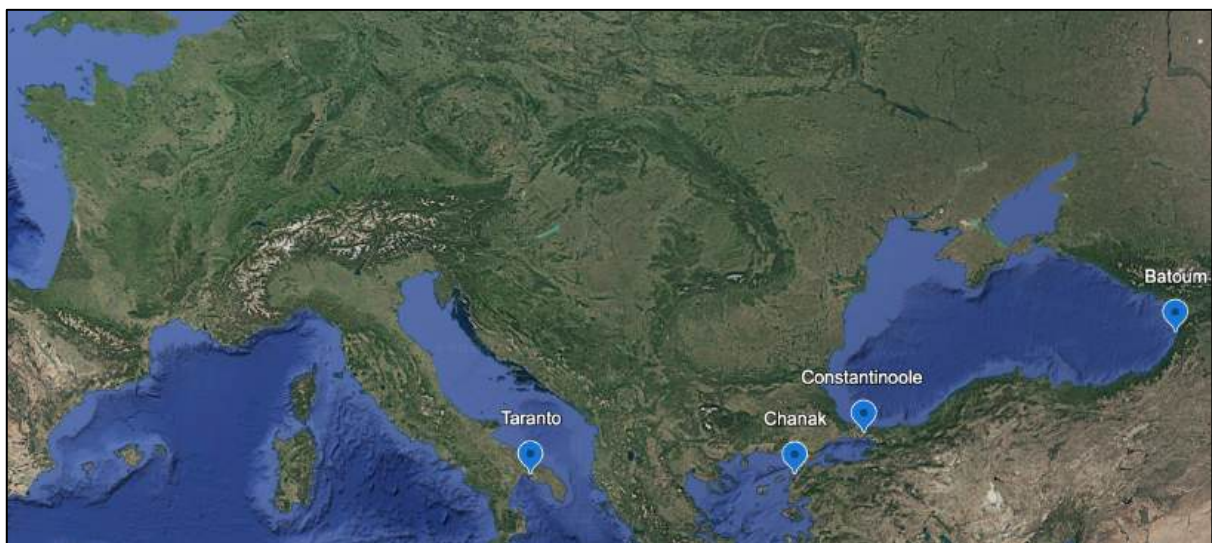

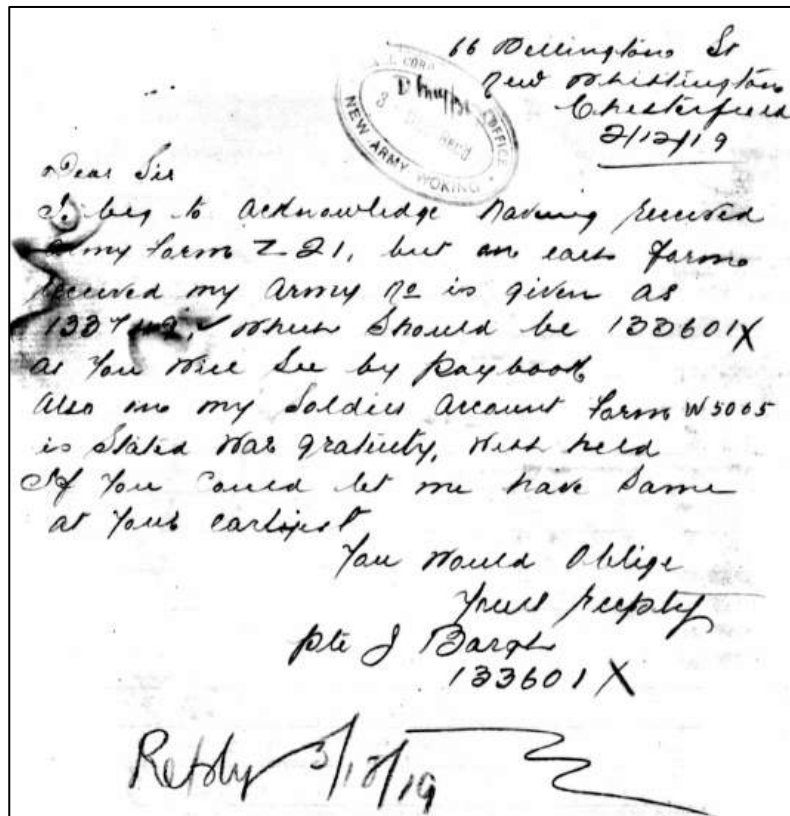
