On the 11th November 1916 to he was posted to the 4th Reserve Battalion the Buffs as it absorbed the 2/5th Battalion. they were based in Canterbury.







The 6th Buffs were part of the 37th Brigade, 12th (Eastern) Division and were in Sombrin in January 1917 moving to the trenches near Arras mid month, possibly Stephens first time in the front line.



The attack on the flanks of the 6th Buffs were unsuccessful and but 2 officers and about 40 men of the 6th Buffs had moved forward to a position NE of Keeling Copes where they expended all their ammunition and were forced to make their way back through 3 lines of German trenches. only the 2 officers and 13 men made it back.

The chief difficulty for the attacks was the darkness, zero hour fixed at 3.45 a.m. The battalion spent the preceding night in shell holes, A Company on the right, B on the left, C supporting, and **D being behind B**. Punctually at 3:45 the guns fired and the men went off into the darkness, following the creeping barrage. Every effort was made to keep communication with them, an advanced HQ established in Devil's Trench but no communication was possible. Apparently the battalion was advancing satisfactorily, but nothing definite could be ascertained. When daylight came the gunfire and snipers made it hard to get any news of how matters were proceeding but by dusk it was discovered that the 6th Buffs had suffered greatly and that the line in their front was practically as before.

The loss of officers required two to be sent up from the detail camp arriving about 10 pm and were sent forward to reorganize what was left of the Battalion.

Part of the objective allotted the 6th Buffs was Keeling Copse, and it was found that 2 officers with about 40 men and a lewis gun had got there, only to discover that they were completely isolated, the enemy having reformed his line behind them, and both sides being their original trenches. Three lines of Germans were now between these few men and remainder of the battalion.


The men at Keeling Copse held their own all day, and when night fell having expended every cartridge and bomb they fought their way back again, breaking through one line after another. 2 officers and 13 men made it back.

Casualties were 3 officers killed, 3 wounded, 8 missing, 25 other ranks killed, 128 wounded and 207 missing.

Stephen was one of the 207 men missing, noted on his records.

Where exactly Stephen went missing and at what point in the attack is not known. He was taken Prisoner Of War (POW)



There is no documentation that suggests Stephen was wounded.

The first German POW files dated the 29th June show he was captured near Arras on the 3rd May 1917 a Private in the East Kent regiment (the Buffs) and in D Company.

He was taken to Dulmen POW Camp almost certainly via Lille.








On a POW record dated the 18^{th} February 1918 from Gustrow Camp Stephen is shown having moved there at some point from Dulmen.



Conditions in POW camps were often poor, the men in overcrowded accommodation, poorly fed and expected to undertake hard labour, perfect conditions for the spread of disease.

Stephen was buried in the Prisoner Cemetery at Gustrow Camp (pictured), the exact location not known.

Nothing is left of the camp today except the Memorial in a now wooded area, no visible signs of the Cemetery where Stephen was first buried.




The derelict memorial today in the Cemetery.




Stephens must have been notified of him being a POW by early August 1917 as he was noted in the published Casualty List on the 4th August 1917.




For his service Stephen was awarded the British War and Victory medal. Noted on the index card is 'Returned' this may have been by his father as next of kin or that a correct address was not found.






